Corbezzolo
SARDINIA

Little grows on Sardinia's Mount Arci, where Luigi Manias, Italy's bee authority, oversees the honey harvest from the strawberry tree, a shrub-like plant with brightly colored, fuzzy fruits. The resulting corbezzolo honey is bittersweet with a grainy, almost crunchy texture. gustiamo.com

BIG ISLAND

Ancient Hawaiians considered the endemic ohi'a tree sacred; it sprouted from lava flows. Its red, spiky Lehua blossoms produce a thick, creamy honey the color of sugar cookies, fragrant with a delicately sweet, floral flavor. bigislandbees.com

Eucalyptus
MAURITIUS

Mauritius has Pierre Poivre, an 18th-century island administrator, to thank for smuggling pepper into the Botanical Garden of Pamplemousses. Because honeys retain flavor from blossoms and their environs, Poivre d'Or's eucalyptus honey, collected from this garden, is spicy, complex and redolent of figs. gourmetlibrary.com
